

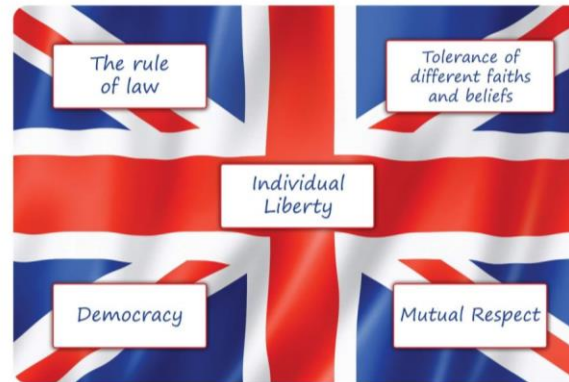
English at Langley Park Primary School



Democracy

The rule of law
