

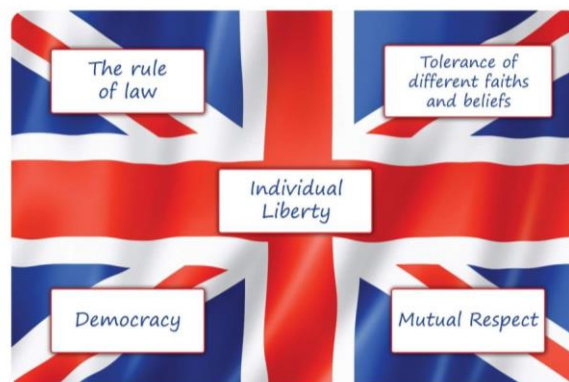

Democracy

Children are encouraged to express their opinions, make choices in their learning, and participate in group decision-making, fostering a sense of voice and agency. They learn that their ideas matter through activities like voting for stories, choosing play areas, and sharing preferences during circle time.

BRITISH VALUES



British values are embedded into our Geography curriculum to help pupils develop an understanding of the society they live in, as well as a respect for democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

The rule of law

Clear routines, boundaries, and expectations help children understand the importance of rules and fairness in creating a safe and respectful environment. Children explore the concept of rules through stories, role-play, and discussions about consequences, helping them develop a sense of justice and responsibility.

Individual liberty

The curriculum promotes independence, personal goal-setting, and freedom to explore interests, empowering children to make confident choices. Children are supported to take risks, solve problems, and reflect on their learning, which nurtures self-confidence and a sense of personal achievement.

Mutual respect

Respect is embedded through role-modelling, inclusive practices, and daily interactions that teach empathy, cooperation, and appreciation of others. Children learn to listen, take turns, and celebrate each other's successes, building a classroom culture of kindness and collaboration.

Tolerance of different faiths and beliefs

Children learn about diverse cultures, traditions, and celebrations—such as Diwali, Chinese New Year, and Easter—encouraging understanding and acceptance of differences. Through stories, themed activities, and discussions, children begin to appreciate the richness of different backgrounds and learn to value diversity.
